FINAL CITATION ORDER

The Application of Lori Wrotenbery, Director of the Oil and Gas Conservation Division, Oklahoma Corporation Commission, came on for hearing before ALJ Kathy McKeown on the 3rd day of March 2009 in the Commission Court Room, Kerr State Office Building, Tulsa, Oklahoma. Applicant requested a Final Order.

Appearance was entered by Connie Moore, attorney for Applicant.

FINDINGS AND CONCLUSIONS

1. Notice is proper and the Commission has jurisdiction over the Respondent, the subject matter and has authority to enter this Order.
2. This matter relates to the Unknown #1: SE/4 SW/4 NW/4 NW/4, Section 27, Township 26 North, Range 16 East, Nowata County, Oklahoma. Respondent was served with the Complaint Citation on February 12, 2009. Commission Field Inspector, Billy Schufeldt, alleges that the Respondent is the owner/operator of the subject well and that the Unknown #1 was being used as an injection/disposal well without a permit as required by OCC-OAC 165:10-5-2. The Rule provides that "The Commission shall fine an operator \$5,000.00 for any violation of this subsection.
3. To resolve the matter, Respondent agreed to pay the \$5,000.00 fine; to properly permit the well as an injection/disposal well; and, to refrain from using the well until properly permitted. Respondent, also agrees to initiate the permitting process within 30 days of this Order.


4. The ALJ finds that the Respondent is in violation of OCC-OAC 165:10-5-2, which provides for a fine of \$5,000.00. The ALJ recommends that Respondent's agreement with the District Office to come into compliance with the required permit and paperwork should be adopted. The ALJ further recommends that a final order issue in this Cause.

ORDER


IT IS THEREFORE THE ORDER OF THE OKLAHOMA CORPORATION COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:




