P E T I T I O N

The petitioner, The British-American Oil Producing Company, a corporation, respectfully shows to the Oklahoma Corporation Commission the following:

1. Petitioner is the owner and operator of valid and subsisting oil and gas leases covering lands located within an area in Grady and Stephens Counties, Oklahoma, a plat and a description of said area appearing as Exhibits A and B, respectively, to the Plan of Unitization attached hereto. By this reference said plat and description are hereby made a part hereof. A portion of the Second and Third Bromide Sands, a common source of supply of natural gas and natural gas condensate, underlies said area, and said portion of said common source of supply has been defined and determined to be productive of natural gas and natural gas condensate by actual drilling operations, a total of ten producing wells having been drilled thereto within said area.

2. The unitized management, operation and further development of said portion of said common source of supply is reasonably necessary in order to effectively carry on pressure-maintenance, repressuring, cycling or waterflooding operations, or some combination thereof, or

some other form of joint effort calculated to substantially increase the ultimate recovery of natural gas and natural gas condensate from said portion of said common source of supply.

3. One or more of said unitized methods of operation, as applied to such portion of said common source of supply, are feasible, will prevent waste, and will with reasonable probability result in the increased recovery of substantially more natural gas and natural gas condensate from said common source of supply than will otherwise be recovered.

4. The estimated additional cost of conducting such operations will not exceed the value of the additional natural gas and natural gas condensate so recovered.

5. Such unitization and the adoption of one or more of such unitized methods of operation is for the common good and will result in the general advantage of the owners of the oil and gas rights within said portion of said common source of supply which will be directly affected.

6. The said area proposed for inclusion in the unit area is of such size and shape as may be reasonably required for the successful and efficient conduct of the proposed unitized methods of operation, and the conduct thereof will have no adverse effect upon the remainder of said common source of supply.


7. Attached hereto is a recommended Plan of Unitization applicable to said proposed unit area which the petitioner considers to be fair, reasonable and equitable, and the same meets all of the statutory requirements.

WHEREFORE, petitioner requests that this petition be set for hearing upon a day certain, that notice thereof be given as required by law, and that, upon hearing the evidence to be adduced in support hereof, the Commission enter an order herein finding the facts stated above to be true, approving said proposed plan of unitization, creating a unit to be known as the Knox Bromide Sands Unit, and providing

for the unitization and unitized operation of said portion of said common source of supply, all upon such terms and conditions as may be shown by the evidence to be fair, reasonable, equitable and necessary or proper to protect, safeguard, and adjust the respective rights and obligations of the several parties affected, all in the manner and form provided by said proposed plan of unitization and by the applicable statutes of the States of Oklahoma.
